Giuseppe Ungaretti and August Stramm are part of the European avant-garde of modern poetry. The work of both poets is also based on their own war experiences in the Great War, known also as the First World War. August Stramm served as an officer in the theatre of war on the frontline in Eastern Europe, Giuseppe Ungaretti served as a soldier in the theatre of war in the mountains and valleys of the Isonzo river in the Alpe-Adriatic region. Stramm was killed in combat on September 1, 1915, Ungaretti survived the horrors of the Great War at the Isonzo theatre of war front. The title of this theatre production also recalls the conflicts in the Middle East, which has once again become a geopolitical war zone since the massacres on October 7, 2023 on Israeli territory committed by terror groups from the Gaza Strip. The titles of the scenes and poems by Giuseppe Ungaretti are programmatic, with "Vegliga / Night Watch" and "War Grave" by August Stramm.
